EDUCATION

Section Summary

The K-12 education system plays a critical role in preparing students for the workforce. However, filling jobs vacated by retirees, keeping up with new technologies, and meeting the talent needs of employers increasingly requires education after high school. Postsecondary certifications, associate's degrees, and bachelor's degrees will continue to be in particularly high demand.

The region's attainment of high school diplomas is on pace with state and national levels for the population ages 25 and older. However, the share of Southwest Michigan residents who hold bachelor's degrees or higher continues to lag behind Michigan and the United States. This could pose problems over the next five years as baby boomers retire and the number of jobs requiring a four-year college education increases.

As for current students, Van Buren County is above the state average in all student proficiency metrics. Berrien County students surpass the state's marks for high school testing, while the county's elementary students fall below Michigan's measures. Cass County students show the exact opposite: elementary students exceed state averages, but high school students fall short on proficiency measures. The good news for all three counties is that there are robust career and technical education programs offered, particularly in Van Buren County.


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Berrien County Educational Attainment for Population 25 Years and Over, 2012




Cass County Educational Attainment for Population 25 Years and Over, 2012


